

North Dakota State Grant and Scholarship Programs 2025-2026

The cost of attending college can vary depending on the college selected, the number of credits enrolled, as well as other expenses such as room/board, books and supplies, transportation and other miscellaneous educational and living expenses. Financial aid programs, such as grants, scholarships, Federal Work Study, and reciprocity programs exist to help students make college affordable. The North Dakota University System (NDUS) administers state grants, scholarships, reciprocity, and other incentive programs. Students should also pursue federal financial aid, including Federal Work Study and student loans, as well as other institutional and outside scholarship opportunities. The first step in applying is to complete the [Free Application for Federal Student Aid \(FAFSA\)](#).

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The ND Career Builders Scholarship & Loan Repayment programs are designed to fill high-need jobs in ND. The goal is to attract and retain talent within the state and address workforce shortages.

- For the scholarship, qualifying programs of study must relate to the high-need occupations in the state.
- Both the scholarship and loan repayment have residency and ND work requirements of 3 years.
- Students who do not complete their program of study, who fail to live within ND [or within 50 miles of the border (new applicants as of 8/1/25)], or who fail to work in an in-demand occupation within ND for at least 3 years following program completion, must repay the scholarship.
- Up to \$17,000 per recipient.
- This is a matching program. Matching funds from a private-sector business or other qualifying public funds must be received prior to the state funds being issued.

	Midwest Student Exchange Program	Offered by the Midwest Higher Education Commission, the Midwest Student Exchange Program (MSEP) enables students to enroll in out-of-state colleges and universities at no more than 150 percent of the institutions' resident tuition rate.
